## **CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY MONTH!**

Print out the cards then cut and fold along the designated lines.

The picture and the name of the celebrity are on one side and the facts are on the back side.

## Ideas for use:

- Extra blank sheets are given so the teacher or student may research their own celebrity.
- There are 28 cards Study one for each day of February.
- The teacher can quiz the class.
- The students can guiz themselves or each other
- Play a game as a class or divide into two or more teams:
- Option 1: One team describes the celebrity while the other team attempts to answer.
- Option 2: One team animates the character while the other team attempts to answer.
- Option 3: The teacher reads the facts and the students verbally share or write down the answer


