

## Different Kinds of Sentences



### **Interrogative and Imperative Sentences**

A writer needs to use different kinds of sentences to express different thoughts or ideas. **Interrogative sentences** ask questions. A **interrogative sentence** ends with a question mark (?). An **imperative sentence** makes a command. An **imperative sentence** ends with a period (.).

#### Examples

What is your favorite animal? (interrogative)  
Sue, go get the milk from the refrigerator. (imperative)

### Identify It

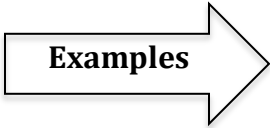
